SEVEN RULES TO FOLLOW

"You therefore, beloved, knowing this beforehand, be on your guard lest, being carried away by the error of unprincipled men, you fall from your own steadfastness, but **grow in the grace and knowledge** of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ ..." 2Pe.3:17-18

"Therefore leaving the elementary teaching about the Christ, let us press on to maturity ..." Heb.6:1

To grow and mature we need to follow some Bible-based rules.

Rules offer the following:

- They provide guidelines.
- They delineate between what is acceptable and what is not acceptable.
- They enable one to reach the desired goal. Gal.6:16

Following rules takes discipline and diligence. 2Ti.2:1

"...discipline yourself for the purpose of godliness." 1Ti.4:7

The following rules are gleaned from the Bible: Christians would do well to heed.

RULE #1: BE CAREFUL WHAT AND HOW YOU SPEAK

Don't tell all you know.

"A prudent man conceals knowledge, but the heart of fools proclaim folly." Pro.12:23

Don't be hasty with words.

"Do you see a man who is hasty in words? There is more hope for a fool than for him." Pro.29:20

Learn to control the "door of the mouth."

"Set a guard, O Lord, over my mouth; keep watch over the door of my lips." Psa.141:3

Speak with grace, kindness. "... Seasoned as with salt." Col.4:6

A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in pictures of silver." Pro. 25;11 "By forbearance a ruler is persuaded, a soft tongue breaks bones." Pro.25:15

Say what you mean and mean what you say.

"Speak truth, each one of you, with his neighbor." Eph.4:25

Refrain from participating in gossip; refuse to listen or to pass it on.

"He who goes about as a talebearer reveals secrets, but he who is trustworthy conceals the matter." Pro.11:13

RULE #2: DON'T BE OVERLY DISTURBED BY WHAT OTHERS SAY

People will find fault—there is no stopping them.

Fault-finders need no ammunition: they manufacture own. Psa.64:1-6

Rumors don't need the support of facts-only suspicions.

One can't escape criticism—even by doing nothing.

Do what is right: let God judge. 1Co.4:3-4

RULE #3: GIVE CREDIT WHEN DUE

Be free and impartial in praise. 1Ti.5:21 **Appreciate the efforts of others.** Phi.4:14ff **Don't take credit for another's efforts**. Gal.6:4 **Note:** 2Co.8:1-4, 9:1-2

RULE #4: DON'T BE ANXIOUS TO RECEIVE YOUR 'DUE'

Praise is most uncertain, fickle, and often unfairly distributed. Don't do good just for the praise. Mat.6:1

Do what is right because it is right. 1Co.4:5

"Much good is done when no one worries about who gets the credit."

RULE #5: BE INTERESTED IN OTHERS, NOT JUST SELF

A life too small to include others, is too small to include the Lord.* "But through love serve one another." Gal.5:13

Be interested, but not meddling. "... attend to your own business ..." 1Th.4:11 Be a joy to be around by sharing others' grief and happiness. Rom.12:15. Gal.6:2

RULE #6: PRESERVE AN OPEN MIND

Be quick to hear, slow to speak. Jam.1:19

Don't condemn, sentence, and execute judgment before hearing.

"He who gives an answer before he hears, it is folly and shame to him." Pro.18:13

Maintaining an "open mind" does not mean, however, it's never made up. 2Ti.3:14, Rom.14:5

RULE #7: DON'T BE CONTENTIOUS, ARGUMENTIVE

"No one is so ignorant as the one who refuses to be taught."

No one is so blind as one who refuses to see. Joh.9:40

Know the difference between contending for the faith and being contentious. $\rm Jde.3$

Be kind and gentle in dealing with those who are in opposition. 2Ti.2:24-26 **Be firm in dealings with others.** 1Co.16:13
